A Message to the Residents and Taxpayers of the City of Pawtucket



Dear Pawtucket Friends and Neighbors:
As we begin 2024, my family and I want to wish all of you a healthy and prosperous new year!

This year has brought momentous change to our great city as we continue to make Pawtucket a better place to live, work, and play. We have made great strides in the areas of education, economic development, and of course quality of life.

Making investments in our students and public schools is a top priority of not only my administration but also the Pawtucket City Council and the Pawtucket School Committee. Last year, Pawtucket voters overwhelmingly approved a bond question for the construction of a new, state-of-the-art Pawtucket High School, a transformational investment in the future success of generations of Pawtucket students. Over the course of 2023, we have worked diligently to apply for funding and create plans for

the new school. Progress continues on a new Baldwin Elementary School, and we also opened “Everyone’s Playground”, one of the only ADA-accessible, all-inclusive recreational facilities in the State of Rhode Island. We are constantly pursuing new opportunities to invest in education for all students here in Pawtucket.

In January of 2022, we officially opened the Pawtucket-Central Falls Transit Hub. This train and bus center will help create a transit-oriented development district that provides MBTA service to Providence and Boston. More than just a train station, the surrounding district has already attracted tens of millions of dollars in investment including historic mill conversions into new housing units and businesses. The district will also feature several new green spaces to provide recreation, shade, and improved stormwater management.

The Tidewater Landing Project was in full stride this past year and continues to move forward. This project is the largest economic development project in our city’s history. It will create a vibrant mixed-use destination along the banks of the Seekonk River including a 10,000-seat soccer stadium, public waterfront amenities, hundreds of housing units, 60,000 square feet of commercial space, and 57,000 square feet of retail and restaurant space. You can drive by the site today and see the steel beams and other structural elements of the stadium emerging

already! We can’t wait for RIFC and their mascot “Chip” to begin playing here in 2025 with the other developments to follow.

When it comes to quality of life, we continue to work hard to improve basic city services and invest in our physical infrastructure. In the past twelve years, we have paved nearly 75% of Pawtucket’s roads. We’ve also improved trash collection and launched a new bulky waste pickup option.

Additionally, this past March the city hired Charles “Chachi” Carvalho as our Chief Equity Officer. Under Mr. Carvalho’s leadership, the city has hosted a variety of flag-raising and cultural events, such as our first-ever Hispanic Heritage and Black History Month award ceremonies. We’ve hosted annual events such as the Pawtucket Arts Festival, Empanada Fest,

Fourth of July Fireworks, St. Patrick’s Day Parade, Trunk or Treat, Haunted Tunnel, and the Pawtucket Hall of Fame Awards; all of which have been a great success!

I want to thank our amazing calendar sponsors, who allowed us to share this beautiful and helpful resource, the 2023 City of Pawtucket Calendar, with you. I would also like to thank our hardworking employees as well as all of the members of our City’s boards and commissions for all that they do to make this city a better place. We hope you enjoy this year’s calendar, with information on scheduled events, how to contact your elected officials, city services, and much more.

Once again, I wish you and your family all the best in 2024, and remember that we are here to support you!

What you need to know about Trash, Recycling, Mattress, Yard Waste, and Other Bulky Items.



Did you know? That loads of recycling that are highly contaminated with trash - things like food waste, yard waste, construction debris, textiles, and bulk waste - can be rejected from the recycling facility? It costs the City \$250 plus UP TO \$90/ton to dispose of highly contaminated loads. Last year it cost the city approximately \$80,000. Please do your part by sticking to these rules of thumb for what to recycle in your blue cart.

RULES OF THUMB FOR YOUR RECYCLING CART:

PLASTICS

RULE: Recycle plastic **CONTAINERS**, up to 2 gallons in size ONLY. Disregard numbers and triangle.
EXCEPTIONS? No Styrofoam cups/containers, plastic bags, “empty” automotive fluid bottles, “compostable” cups, black planters and plug trays, acrylic or plexiglass cases.
PREP: Empty and rinse. Don’t crush flat. No straws. Gently replace caps and lids first and then recycle. Take plastic shopping bags back to any large grocery, pharmacy or big-box store for recycling.

GLASS

RULE: Recycle glass **jars and bottles ONLY**.
EXCEPTIONS? No “Pyrex” containers.
PREP: Empty and rinse. Remove metal lids/caps first and recycle both separately.

METALS

RULE: Recycle metal **cans/foil and lids/caps from glass jars + bottles ONLY**.
EXCEPTIONS? No yogurt lids or foil-like candy/chip wrappers.
PREP: Empty and rinse. No product, air or noise should come from aerosol cans when the nozzle is pressed down. Don’t crush cans flat. Do bunch up foil first.

PAPER/CARDBOARD

RULE: Recycle paper/cardboard that is **free of food and grease, isn’t treated to be waterproof** (e.g. fridge or freezer boxes, paper coffee cups) + **isn’t for sanitary use** (e.g. napkins, paper towels) ONLY.
EXCEPTIONS? Please **DO** recycle waterproof **cartons** (e.g. milk, juice, soup, broth).
PREP: It’s OK to leave tape/labels/staples on. Replace plastic caps back on cartons’ plastic spouts first, then recycle.

ELECTRONICS

RULE: Anything that plugs into your wall should not be placed in your recycle cart. When in doubt, call your DPW at 401-728-0500, ext. 233. **No exceptions.** Electronics can also be dropped off at **Green Tech Assets, 1110 Central Ave. Pawtucket.** For questions call 401-721-9996 To find more items you can drop off for recycling at RI Resource Recovery, visit www.rirrc.org/sva For an A-Z list of materials and proper recycling/disposal instructions, visit <http://atoz.rirrc.org>

TEXTILE RECYCLING

The city started a textile recycling program. Residents will now be able to dispose of their old clothing, belts, purses, and shoes thru this program. Residents can either pick up a yellow textile recycling bag from City Hall or Public Works or for the first time you can use a trash bag labeled textile recycling. The company will be checking the recycling routes and if they pick up a bag, they will leave you a new bag so you can continue the program. There are also **Big Brother/Big Sister** bins throughout the city.

MATTRESS & E-WASTE COLLECTION (for City residents only)

All collections will be at the parking lot on Roosevelt Avenue across from City Hall on the first Saturday of the month (unless noted otherwise due to another event or weather). Please refer to www.pawtucketri.com/public-works-department for dates and times. Recyclable Mattress and Box Springs can also be dropped off at Tuff Stuff Recycling 345 Walcott St Pawtucket, RI 02860 Monday thru Friday 8 AM to 2 PM. YARD WASTE/LEAF PAPER BAG PROGRAM

For twigs, leaves and grass clippings, the program begins **Monday, April 1** and ends **Friday, December 6**. Yard waste must be in composting bags or loose in barrels clearly marked yard waste. **No plastic bags allowed.** Composting bags may be purchased at retail locations.

RECYCLING/CURBSIDE RUBBISH COLLECTION

Only city issued carts for recycling and trash will be collected curbside. Loose garbage in the carts will not be collected. All residential solid waste & recycling carts or textile recycling bags shall be placed at the curb, in front of said residence, not before 4:00 p.m., the day before collection. All carts shall be removed from the curb no longer than eight hours after collection. No carts shall be placed in or on the street.

All trash bags should be placed in barrels. The State has implemented a mixed-recycling program.

RESIDENTIAL ONLY RUBBISH AND YARD WASTE DROP-OFF

City residents can use the City Transfer Station 240 Grotto Avenue
• Mon. - Fri. 8:00 am – 2:00 pm and Sat. 8:00 am – 1:00 pm
The Transfer Station is open to the residents of Pawtucket only. Resident must provide a valid license showing an address within the City of Pawtucket, NO EXCEPTIONS. There will be NO CONSTRUCTION OR COMMERCIAL WASTE accept at the Transfer Station., RI Resource Recovery is the only option for disposal of these items For additional information please visit www.pawtucketri.com/public-works-department

SANITATION BULKY WASTE

Appointments are required for special pick ups. There is a fee for: box springs, mattresses, refrigerators and freezers. Appointments are needed (at no charge) for large items such as T.V.’s, appliances, and metal. **Furniture items need to be scheduled for curbside collection. Residents can schedule up to 3 pieces for each collection date.** Please email dpw@pawtucketri.com or call 728-0500 ext. 233 for appointment. CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING RULES

Trees will be collected on your trash day throughout the month of January. Trees are to be bare, no lights, no tinsel, and not placed in a plastic bag. Trees not meeting these requirements will not be picked-up.

Items accepted at no charge: Computers, laptops, monitors, televisions, routers, PDA's, cell phones, mice, keyboards, ink-jet printers, plastic speakers, toner cartridges, CD/DVD players, radios, network equip-ment, wires, stereos, telephones, micro-waves, small household appliances, and auto/marinebatteries, and battery back-ups.

A \$10 disposal fee applies to each large wooden-boxed speakers (\$5 for small), laser-jet printer, air conditioner, dehumidifier, and other coolant containing devices.





Smoke & Carbon Monoxide Alarms
 Every level of the home, including basements, should have its own smoke & CO alarms. Place them outside bedrooms. Additionally, smoke alarms are required in every bedroom for homes built after February 2004 and for all three-family houses and apartment buildings regardless of age. Smoke & CO alarms should also be inside any bedroom directly off of a kitchen. Test the alarms once a month. Practice fire drills in the home with your family while testing the alarms. Change batteries every six months. Replace smoke alarms after 10 years. Replace CO alarms and combination alarms after 8 years. 
