



CITY OF PAWTUCKET, RI COMMUNITY IMPACT & EDUCATION GRANT

The City of Pawtucket is excited to launch an American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funded Community Impact and Education Grant. This initiative is designed to address critical needs within the community, particularly those exacerbated by the ongoing challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic.

By focusing on education and community impact, this grant program will empower residents, strengthen community resilience, and foster positive social change. These grants can serve as catalysts for innovation, expansion, or targeted interventions that address pressing community needs.

Grants will be made available for between \$10,000 and \$300,000 and will be available for programs lasting up to 2 years and ending in July 2026.

There are three project types that are eligible for this program.

- **Community Impact Grants:** Projects that directly support communities, individuals and households that were impacted by COVID-19.
- **Community Education:** Projects of a broad range that are designed to support the most disproportionately impacted communities.
- **Youth Education:** Projects with curriculum designed to catch youth up from lost educational time due to the pandemic.
