

A Message to the Residents and Taxpayers of the City of Pawtucket



Dear Pawtucket Friends and Neighbors,

As we enter 2025, my family and I extend our heartfelt wishes for a year filled with health, happiness, and growth for you and our great city.

In 2024, we continued our dedication to fostering an inclusive and vibrant community. We celebrated diversity through numerous flag-raising ceremonies, including those for the Dominican Republic, Greece, Cape Verde, and PRIDE, and hosted Women's History and Black History Month interactive art galleries. Our annual Impact Awards honored achievements during Black History and Hispanic Heritage Month. The Kretcheu Festival, the AAPI Month celebration, and the beloved Empanada Fest highlighted our cultural heritage.

2024 was also a standout year for our youth, with victories from the Pawtucket Girls Basketball, Boys Volleyball, and Cheer

teams, who all earned titles. We continued our annual Youth-to-Senior Snow Shoveling Program, providing support across generations and fostering civic responsibility.

Pawtucket made significant strides in infrastructure with the development of the Pawtucket-Attleboro Emergency Water Connection and the addition of 270 new parking spaces at the Central Falls Transit Hub. We marked the steel topping ceremony for both Baldwin Elementary School and the Tidewater Landing stadium, strengthening our commitment to educational and recreational infrastructure. Road improvements funded by a \$600,000 RIDOT grant and a new pedestrian bridge project at Tidewater further advanced connectivity and access across the city.

Our support for local business and community initiatives remained steadfast. In 2023, we conducted over 50 small business visits, supporting minority- and women-owned enterprises. We awarded \$1.7 million to organizations tackling the opioid crisis and granted \$1,000 scholarships to 24 students. Additionally, community development block grants, totaling hundreds of thousands, aided local initiatives.

Our commitment to environmental sustainability earned us recognition as a National Tree City by the Arbor Day Foundation. We received a \$250,000 grant to enhance Riverside Cemetery and another \$400,000 for the new ADA-friendly John St. Splash Pad, promoting access-

sibility and green spaces. Being named one of Money Magazine's "50 Best Places to Live" reaffirmed our city's progress and quality of life.

Our community events were as spirited as ever, with highlights including the Pawtucket Arts Festival, the Dragon Boat Race, Taste of Pawtucket, and July 3rd Fireworks. This year, we introduced new city entryway signs and banners and created a simplified licensing process for events. Our new ADA-friendly website improves access to information, and our bilingual elections coordinator and partnerships with translation companies enhance inclusivity in city services.

There is so much to look forward to in 2025. From the inaugural game at Tidewater Stadium in the Spring, to thousands of new housing developments being created in the downtown area, to improvements to our roads, sewers, and basic infrastructure. Pawtucket is resilient, and we will continue to grow and thrive.

I want to thank our amazing calendar sponsors, who allowed us to share this beautiful and helpful resource, the 2025 City of Pawtucket Calendar, with you. I would also like to thank our hardworking employees as well as all of the members of our City's boards and commissions for all that they do to make this city a better place. We hope you enjoy this year's calendar, with information on scheduled events, how to contact your elected officials, city services, and much more.

Once again, I wish you and your family all the best in 2025, and remember that we are here to support you!





What you need to know about Trash, Recycling, Mattress, Yard Waste, and Other Bulky Items.

Did you know? That loads of recycling that are highly contaminated with trash - things like food waste, yard waste, construction debris, textiles, and bulk waste - can be rejected from the recycling facility? It costs the City \$250 plus UP TO \$90/ton to dispose of highly contaminated loads. Last year it cost the city approximately \$80,000. Please do your part by sticking to these rules of thumb for what to recycle in your blue cart.

RULES OF THUMB FOR YOUR RECYCLING CART:

PLASTICS

RULE: Recycle plastic CONTAINERS, up to 2 gallons in size ONLY. Disregard numbers and triangle.

EXCEPTIONS? No Styrofoam cups/containers, plastic bags, "empty" automotive fluid bottles, "compostable" cups, planters and plug trays, acrylic or plexiglass cases.

PREP: Empty and rinse. Don't crush or flatten. Replace caps and lids first and then recycle. No straws.

Take plastic shopping bags back to any large grocery, pharmacy or big-box store for recycling.

GLASS

RULE: Recycle glass jars and bottles ONLY.

EXCEPTIONS? No "Pyrex" containers.

PREP: Empty and rinse. Remove metal lids/caps first and recycle both separately.

METALS

RULE: Recycle metal cans/foil and lids/caps from glass jars + bottles ONLY.

EXCEPTIONS? No yogurt lids or foil-like candy/chip wrappers.

PREP: Empty and rinse. No product, air or noise should come from aerosol cans when the nozzle is pressed down. Don't crush cans flat. Do bunch up foil first.

PAPER/CARDBOARD

RULE: Recycle paper/cardboard must be **free of food and grease**, **and is not treated with a waterproof coating** e.g. fridge or freezer boxes, paper coffee cups + **isn't for sanitary use** e.g. napkins, paper towels ONLY.

EXCEPTIONS? Please **DO** recycle waterproof **cartons** (e.g. milk, juice, soup, broth).

PREP: It's OK to leave tape/labels/staples on. Replace plastic caps back on cartons' plastic spouts first, then recycle.

ELECTRONICS

RULE: Anything that plugs into your wall should not be placed in your recycle cart.

When in doubt, call your DPW at 401-728-0500, ext. 233. No exceptions.

TEXTILE RECYCLING

The city started a textile recycling program. Residents will now be able to dispose of their old clothing, belts, purses, and shoes thru this program. Residents can place these items in a bag and place them on the sidewalk in front of your house for collection on Wednesday. A second option is to bring these bagged items and place them inside the **Big Brother/Big Sister** bins located throughout the city.

NO BIN - NO BARREL PROGRAM

PLEASE KEEP YOUR SIDEWALK CLEAR OF SNOW & ICE AFTER A SNOW STORM

Remember to clear a path for pedestrians (at least 3 feet wide) so they don't have to walk in the street. (City of Pawtucket Ordinance 351-20)

MATTRESS & E-WASTE COLLECTION (for City residents only)

All collections will be at the parking lot on Roosevelt Avenue across from City Hall on the first Saturday of the month (unless noted otherwise due to another event or weather). Please refer to www.pawtucketri.gov/public-works-department for dates and times

YARD WASTE PROGRAM

For twigs, leaves and grass clippings, the program begins **Monday, April** 7th and will end on **Friday, December 12th.** Yard waste must be in composting bags or loose in barrels clearly marked yard waste.

No plastic bags allowed. Composting bags may be purchased at a retail locations.

LEAF BAGS

Leaf bags may be purchased at retail locations. Leaf bags will not be sold by the City of Pawtucket.

RECYCLING/CURBSIDE RUBBISH COLLECTION

Only city issued carts for recycling and trash will be collected curbside. Loose garbage in the carts will not be collected. All residential solid waste & recycling carts or textile recycling bags shall be placed at the curb, in front of said residence, not before 4:00 p.m., the day before collection. All carts shall be removed from the curb no longer than eight hours after collection. No carts shall be placed in or on the street.

All trash bags are required to be placed inside Official City carts.

BULKY WASTE ITEMS

Appointments are required for special pick ups at no charge, large items such as T.V.'s, appliances, and metal. Furniture items must to be scheduled for curbside collection, residents can schedule up to 3 pieces for each collection date. There is a cost of \$16 per piece for curbside collection for the following: box springs, mattresses, refrigerators and freezers. RESIDENTIAL ONLY – RUBBISH, YARD WASTE, BULKY, COOKING OIL AND MOTOR OIL DROP OFF

City residents can use the City Transfer Station

240 Grotto Avenue Mon. - Fri. 8:00 AM – 2:00 PM and Sat. 8:00 AM – 1:00 PM

The Transfer Station is open to the residents of Pawtucket only. Resident must provide a valid license showing an address within the City of Pawtucket, NO EXCEPTIONS. There will be NO CONSTRUCTION OR COMMERCIAL WASTE accepted at the Transfer Station., RI Resource Recovery is the only option for disposal of these items

CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING RULES

Trees will be collected on your trash day throughout the month of January. Trees are to be bare, no lights, no tinsel, and not placed in a plastic bag. Trees not meeting these requirements will not be picked-up.

STREET SWEEPING

Street Sweeping is scheduled to begin on March 31, 2025 and ends October 31, 2025. All city streets are swept once a month on either the 1st or 2nd recycling week of each month. Any questions please email dpw@pawtucketri.gov.

Items accepted at no charge: Computers, laptops, monitors, televisions, routers, PDA's, cell phones, mouse, keyboards, inkjet printers, plastic speakers, toner cartridges, CD/DVD players, radios, network equipment, wires, stereos, telephones, micro-waves, small household appliances, and auto/marine batteries, and battery backups.

A \$10 disposal fee applies to each large wooden-boxed speakers (\$5 for small), laser-jet printer, air conditioner, dehumidifier, and other coolant containing devices.

Not accepted: Light bulbs, household batteries, fire/carbon monoxide detectors, tapes/disks, glass, broken TV tubes, Styrofoam or any hazardous waste materials.

Smoke & Carbon Monoxide Alarms

Every level of the home, including basements, should have its own smoke & CO alarms. Place them outside bedrooms. Additionally, smoke alarms are required in every bedroom for homes built after February 2004 and for all three-family houses and apartment buildings regardless of age. Smoke & CO alarms should also be inside any bedroom directly off of a kitchen. Test the alarms once a month. Practice fire drills in the home with your family while testing the alarms.

Change batteries every six months. Replace smoke alarms after 10 years. Replace CO alarms and combination alarms after 8 years.


