





## EMERGENCY RESPONSE TO FEDERAL SNAP CHANGES IN PAWTUCKET:

The City of Pawtucket, the Pawtucket School Department, and the Pawtucket Housing Authority have been monitoring the recent federal changes to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). This nationwide disruption is expected to impact nearly 16,000 Pawtucket residents who rely on these benefits. These updates tighten work and participation requirements for adults without dependents and adjust how benefit levels are calculated, potentially slowing future increases. Families with older children and individuals with unstable work or transportation barriers may face new challenges in maintaining benefits.

For Pawtucket, this means an increased risk of food insecurity among working-age adults, seniors, and families already under economic strain. The City and its partners are preparing by expanding outreach, strengthening local food assistance networks, and ensuring residents understand their rights, eligibility, and available supports. This guide provides an updated directory of food pantries, meal programs, and community resources to help residents stay nourished and supported during this transition.







#### **PAWTUCKET'S PLAN OF ACTION:**

The City of Pawtucket, the Pawtucket School Department, and the Pawtucket Housing Authority are coordinating a citywide effort to collect dry goods and non-perishable food items, which will be distributed to local community-based organizations serving families in need.

Donations can be dropped off at Pawtucket City Hall, Fogarty Manor, or at any Pawtucket Public School or the Central Office during regular business hours.

To further assist residents affected by recent changes to food assistance programs, the City has launched an Emergency SNAP Response Line and is working to activate an emergency fund account to expand local relief efforts. Together, these initiatives aim to ensure that no resident goes without access to food or essential support during this period of change. More information will be shared in the coming week(s).







#### IMPORTANT STATEWIDE UPDATES:

- The State of Rhode Island announced a series of actions to support Rhode Islanders, including emergency payments for qualifying families with children through Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF). For more info go to GOVERNOR.RI.GOV
- Any money on your EBT card at the end of October will be rolled over and available for use in November. However, November SNAP food assistance benefits are on hold, and additional benefits will not be available on your EBT card on November 1st unless federal actions are taken.
- SNAP benefits for November will be issued once federal funding is restored.
- Your EBT card WILL NOT be shut off. Please visit <u>SNAPSUPPORT.RI.GOV</u> for the most accurate and updated information.
- DHS remains open and will continue to process cases as usual during the federal shutdown – including processing of applications and re–certifications for all benefit programs.
