A MESSAGE TO THE RESIDENTS AND TAXPAYERS OF THE CITY OF PAWTUCKET



Dear Pawtucket Friends and Neighbors,
As we begin 2026, my family and I wish you a happy, healthy, and prosperous New Year!

This past year has been one of tremendous progress for the City of Pawtucket. Together, we've continued to move our community forward with important investments in education, infrastructure, housing, and economic development—all aimed at improving the quality of life for every resident. Pawtucket remains a creative, resilient, and compassionate city, known for our strong sense of community and as the proud City of the Arts.

We remain committed to ensuring every Pawtucket student has access to the best possible learning environment. Construction is moving forward on the new Pawtucket High School, a once-in-a-generation investment that will provide modern classrooms, career and technical education spaces, and athletic facilities. This new campus will serve as a hub for innovation

and opportunity for decades to come. Following the recent completion of the new Baldwin Elementary School and the successful openings of Winters and Potter-Burns Elementary Schools, we mark a continued transformation of our school facilities citywide.

The City of Pawtucket is dedicated to providing our youth with safe and modern schools and supporting them through various initiatives and programs. One such program is the Ben Mondor and Mayor Grebien Scholarship Program, which last year successfully distributed \$1,000 scholarships to 32 high school students in Pawtucket. Additionally, the City has backed youth sports through the ARPA Youth Sports Revitalization Program and has created summer employment opportunities for youth in partnership with the Nonviolence Institute. This year, I am pleased to announce the creation of a new, City-Wide Youth Commission to engage, mentor, and energize our future leaders.

We've also seen major strides in economic development, including continued progress at Tidewater Landing—the largest project in our city's history. The Centreville Bank stadium has seen record-breaking attendance for the RI Football Club games, bringing excitement, energy, and visitors to our waterfront while supporting hundreds of local jobs. The next phases of mixed-use development will bring new housing, retail, restaurants, and public waterfront access, transforming the Seekonk River corridor into a vibrant destination for all.

In addition, the Pawtucket-Central Falls Commuter Rail Station is now fully operational, connecting residents directly to Providence and Boston. The surrounding Transit-Oriented Development District continues to grow, with new housing, small businesses, and restored mill properties adding to the area's vitality. Green space enhancements and public infrastructure improvements have also strengthened this key gateway into our city.

We continue to focus on delivering reliable and efficient city services that enhance daily life for our residents. Our expanded street paving program, new waste collection services, street sweeping initiative, and citywide signage updates are improving safety and accessibility in every neighborhood. We've also strengthened partnerships with community organizations to support families in need, from food assistance to youth programs and small business aid.

I am also proud to announce that Pawtucket has officially become an AARP Age-Friendly community. This designation connects us to a nationwide network focused on supporting our older adult population and their caregivers, ensuring that their needs are met.

Additionally, the Pawtucket Arts & Culture Commission has partnered with the Harriet Ballou Charitable Foundation and Groundwork Rhode Island for the Outdoor Public Art Mural and Socialization Project at the Leon Mathieu Senior Center and Pawtucket Division of Senior Services. This initiative transforms an underutilized outdoor space into a recreational and event area for older adults and community members.

Thanks to the dedicated efforts of the Leon Mathieu Senior Center and our partners in the Pawtucket Age-Friendly Task Force, we are committed to enhancing the quality of life for older adults in our community.

As we embark on 2026, Pawtucket is at an exciting moment in its history. The progress we've achieved reflects the spirit of our community—hardworking, innovative, and united in purpose. I would like to express my gratitude to our City Council, School Committee, dedicated city employees, and the countless residents, businesses, and volunteers who contribute to making Pawtucket stronger every day.

Finally, I would like to thank our calendar sponsors, whose continued support allows us to provide this year's City of Pawtucket Calendar. Inside, you'll find helpful information on city services, contact details for elected officials, and upcoming events throughout the year.

What you need to know about Trash, Recycling, Mattress, Yard Waste, and Other Bulky Items.

Did you know? That loads of recycling that are highly contaminated with trash - things like food waste, yard waste, construction debris, textiles, and bulk waste - can be rejected from the recycling facility? It costs the City over \$250,000 in additional charges when residents don't recycle properly.

RULES OF THUMB FOR YOUR RECYCLING CART:

PLASTICS

RULE: Recycle plastic **CONTAINERS**, up to 2 gallons in size **ONLY**. Disregard numbers and triangle.
EXCEPTIONS? No Styrofoam cups/containers, plastic bags, "empty" automotive fluid bottles, "compostable" cups, black planters and plug trays, acrylic or plexiglass cases.
PREP: Empty and rinse. Don't crush flat. No straws. Gently replace caps and lids first and then recycle. Take plastic shopping bags back to any large grocery, pharmacy or big-box store for recycling.

GLASS

RULE: Recycle glass **jars and bottles ONLY**.
EXCEPTIONS? No "Pyrex" containers.
PREP: Empty and rinse. Remove metal lids/caps first and recycle both separately.

METALS

RULE: Recycle metal **cans/foil and lids/caps from glass jars + bottles ONLY**.
EXCEPTIONS? No yogurt lids or foil-like candy/chip wrappers.
PREP: Empty and rinse. No product, air or noise should come from aerosol cans when the nozzle is pressed down. Don't crush cans flat. Do bunch up foil first.

PAPER/CARDBOARD

RULE: Recycle paper/cardboard that is **free of food and grease, isn't treated to be waterproof** (e.g. fridge or freezer boxes, paper coffee cups) + **isn't for sanitary use** (e.g. napkins, paper towels) **ONLY**.
EXCEPTIONS? Please **DO** recycle waterproof **cartons** (e.g. milk, juice, soup, broth).
PREP: It's OK to leave tape/labels/staples on. Replace plastic caps back on cartons' plastic spouts first, then recycle.

ELECTRONICS

RULE: Anything that plugs into your wall should not be placed in your recycle cart. When in doubt, call your DPW at 401-728-0500, ext. 233. **No exceptions.** Electronics can also be dropped off at **Green Tech Assets, 1110 Central Ave. Pawtucket**. TEXTILE RECYCLING

Beginning November 16, 2020, the city started a textile recycling program. Residents will now be able to dispose of their old clothing, belts, purses, and shoes thru this program. Residents can either pick up a yellow textile recycling bag from City Hall or Public Works or for the first time you can use a trash bag labeled textile recycling. The company will be checking the recycling routes and if they pick up a bag, they will leave you a new bag, so you can continue the program. There are also **Big Brother/Big Sister** bins throughout the city.

NO BIN - NO BARREL PROGRAM

MATTRESS & E-WASTE COLLECTION (for City residents only)

All collections will be at the parking lot on Roosevelt Avenue across from City Hall on the first Saturday of the month (unless noted otherwise due to another event or weather). Please refer to for dates and times.

Recyclable Mattress and Box Springs can also be dropped off for free at Tuff Stuff Recycling 345 Walcott St Pawtucket, RI 02860 Monday thru Friday 8 AM to 2 PM. For additional information please call 800-273-4137

YARD WASTE PROGRAM

For twigs, leaves and grass clippings, the program begins Monday, April 6 and ends Friday, December 11, 2026. Yard waste must be in composting bags or loose in barrels clearly marked yard waste. **No plastic bags allowed.** Composting bags may be purchased at a retail location.

LEAF BAGS

Leaf bags may be purchased at retail locations. Leaf bags will not be sold by the City of Pawtucket.

RECYCLING/CURBSIDE RUBBISH COLLECTION

Only city issued carts for recycling and trash will be collected curbside. Loose garbage in the carts will not be collected. All residential solid waste & recycling carts or textile recycling bags shall be placed at the curb, in front of said residence, not before 4:00 p.m., the day before collection. All carts shall be removed from the curb no longer than eight hours after collection. No carts shall be placed in or on the street.

All trash bags are required to be placed inside Official City Carts

BULKY WASTE ITEMS

Appointments are required for special pick ups at no charge, large items such as T.V.'s, appliances, and metal. Furniture items must be scheduled for curbside collection, residents can schedule up to 3 pieces for each collection date. There is a cost of \$16 per piece for curbside collection for the following: box springs, mattresses, refrigerators, and freezers. RESIDENTIAL ONLY RUBBISH AND YARD WASTE DROP-OFF

City residents can use the City Transfer Station
240 Grotto Avenue • Mon. - Fri. 8:00 AM – 2:00 PM and Sat. 8:00 AM – 1:00 PM
The Transfer Station is open to the residents of Pawtucket only. Resident must provide a valid license showing an address within the City of Pawtucket, **NO EXCEPTIONS.** There will be **NO CONSTRUCTION OR COMMERCIAL WASTE** accepted at the Transfer Station., RI Resource Recovery is the only option for disposal of these items

CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING RULES

Trees will be collected on your trash day throughout the month of January. Trees are to be bare, no lights, no tinsel, and not placed in a plastic bag. Trees not meeting these requirements will not be picked-up.



Street Sweeping

Street Sweeping begins On March 30, 2026 and ends October 30, 2026. All streets are swept once a month, completed on one of your recycling days. Please refer to the Street Sweeping Calendar insert for additional information.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED: Light bulbs, household batteries, fire/carbon monoxide detectors, tapes/disks, glass, ceramic bowls, broken TV tubes, plastic bags, cardboard, Styrofoam, wood, and any hazardous waste materials.

 February 2004 and for all three-family
 houses regardless of age. CO alarms should
 also be inside any room with a permanently
 installed gas-fueled appliance or fireplace.
 Test the alarms once a month. *Practice fire
 drills in the home with your family while
 testing the alarms.*
 Change batteries every six months.
 Replace alarms after 10 years, or earlier
 if mentioned in the alarm’s instruction
 manual, or if the alarm fails to work when
 tested.

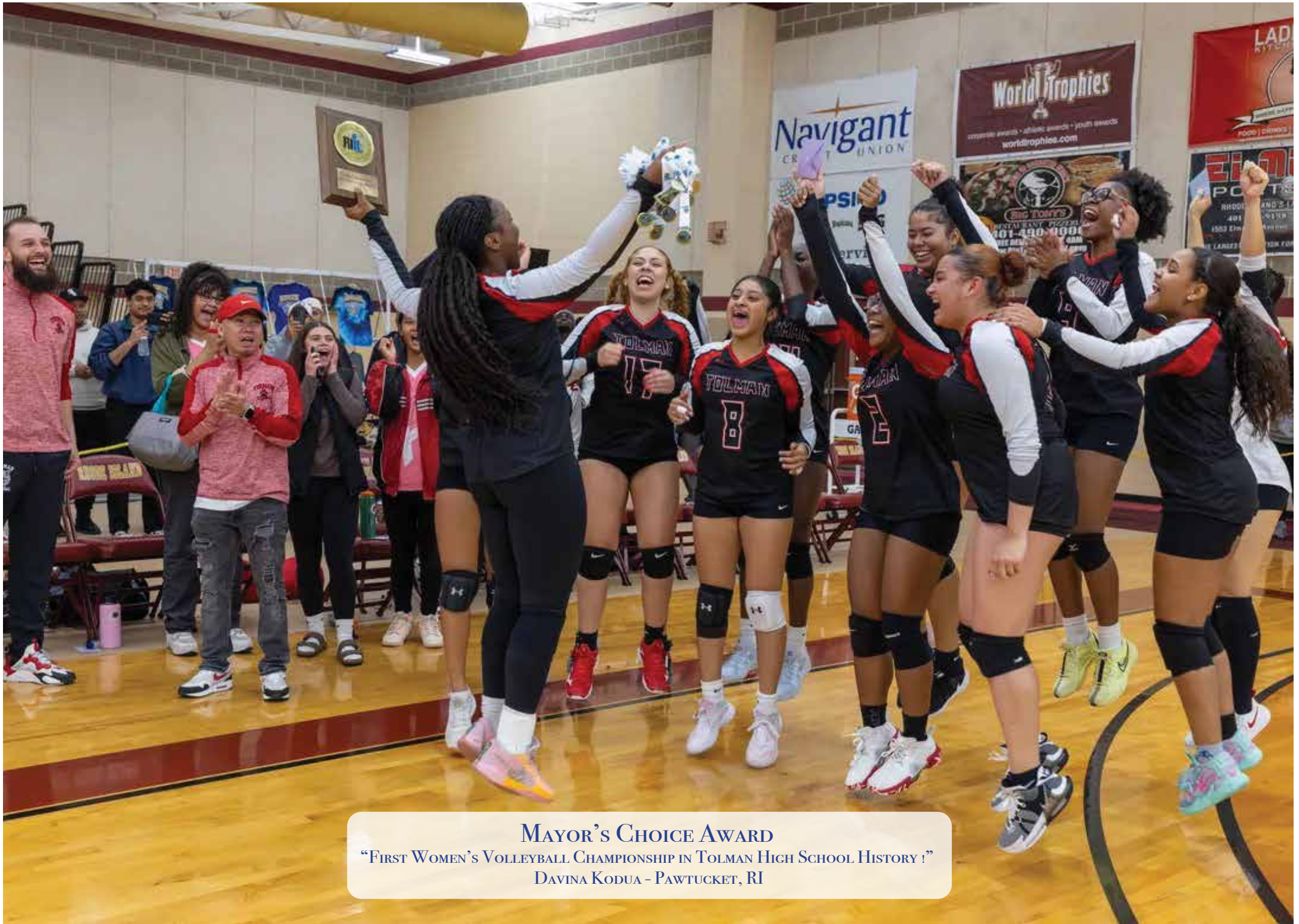
